

Throughout the months to come we will continue to have sanitiser available at the church entry and encourage people to keep social distance of 1.5metres.

Please note the following regulations...

Once 70% of NSW adults are fully vaccinated :

- Only fully vaccinated people over the age of 16 and anyone under the age of 16 can attend a baptism in our churches
- No more than 50 people may attend
- Masks are mandatory for those over the age of 12 (unless they have a medical exemption). The priest, parents and godparents may remove their masks when participating in the ceremony.
- People must scan the NSW QR code at the entry to prove vaccination status and a list of the attendees must be sent to the parish office in the week prior to the baptism (for our COVID register).
- Highly recommended that only immediate family and godparents attend at this stage.

Once 80% of NSW adults are fully vaccinated:

- We can have up to 120 people in attendance at a baptism in Sacred Heart and Blessed Sacrament Churches (regardless of vaccination status)
- Masks are mandatory for those over the age of 12 (unless they have a medical exemption) The priest, parents and godparents may remove their masks when participating in the ceremony.
- People must scan the NSW QR code at the entry and a list of the attendees must be sent to the parish office in the week prior to the baptism (for our COVID register).

From 1st of December:

- Up to 240 people will be allowed in Sacred Heart and Blessed Sacrament Churches
- Masks will no longer be mandatory in the church
